WOODBURN, Ore. – The Oregon Golf Association is proud to announce that it has selected its leadership for the 2026 Girls Junior Americas Cup. Serving as captain is Donna Smoot, while Caroline Inglis-Klopp is serving as assistant captain.

Smoot, who currently is in her second year as OGA President, has a long and storied history with the OGA. Not only has she served on the Executive Committee for nearly a decade, but she also grew up playing Oregon Junior Golf, which eventually led to a golf scholarship to the University of Washington. She continued her golf career after college, turning professional for a time, before returning to the amateur game both as a player and as a high school golf coach.

Inglis-Klopp recently finished up a nine-year career on the LPGA Tour before joining the OGA full-time in December as the Director of Donor Engagement and Development. Inglis-Klopp, an OGA Junior Golf Alumna, is a former two-time participant in the Girls Junior Americas Cup and competed on the collegiate level at the University of Oregon.

“We are thrilled to have both Donna and Caroline accept these roles and represent the OGA,” said CEO Rick Rangel. “They are great stewards of OGA and will do a wonderful job in the year that we as an organization host Girls Junior Americas Cup.”

The 2026 Girls Junior Americas Cup returns to Oregon for the first time in 20 years and will be held from July 19-23 at Illahe Hills Country Club in Salem.
